It is a joy to open this President's report with the news of the acquisition by Sunshine Coast Regional Council of the major portion of the Kingsbridge site on Church and King Streets – a.k.a. Bart's Land. This is a once in a lifetime achievement. Open parkland on the very top of Buderim was a dream few of us thought could ever happen.

That it has is due to the Herculean efforts of a few people. Our thanks must go to Councillors Christian Dickson and Ted Hungerford, the SCRC's CEO John Knaggs and the SCRC Manager of Property Paul Brockwell, all of whom left no bureaucratic stone unturned to find a way to finance the huge cost and to negotiate the best possible outcome with the developers.

Ex-Mayor and Buderim resident Don Culley tirelessly encouraged them and enthused the community into showing overwhelming support. Chair of the BWMCA's Community Precinct Committee, Robyn Edwards, has worked quietly and doggedly for years to obtain some community land on the site and is overwhelmed with this result. To these individuals, their staff and committee members we owe a debt of gratitude that we and generations to come will be able to enjoy space, trees and magnificent views in the heart of a relentlessly growing sea of bricks and mortar.

Last November's AGM seems a long while ago as so many events and activities have happened since. The new Power Point format was judged a great success and the Constitutional changes as outlined in the last Newsletter were passed. I am delighted to personally welcome all new appointees and especially members of the Advisory Committee – after two meetings I predict this will be an enthusiastic, forward looking and formidable committee!

Also in November, legendary Coast singer Bev Gourlay showed outstanding community spirit by bringing together a host of the region's talent for a fund-raising concert to help with upgrading facilities in the Hall. It was a huge success and thousands of dollars were raised. Thank you Bev for this great effort.

Hats off to the BWMCA and Rotary Australia Day Committees who once again worked for months to produce what has become one of the Coast's biggest and most successful events. This was especially true this year when thousands of people defied the incredible heat to enjoy the day.

Finally a tribute to our newest group - Buderim Muscle. Initiated by Steve Chellingworth and managed by Jenny Hope, this comprises Buderim residents who want to contribute but don't want to get caught up in meetings and committees. Instead they come along on the day to help with events and activities. The main service will be held in the pine forest of the Buderim Mt State School commencing at 9.00am after which Friends of Buderim will serve morning tea.
